I have been responsible for writing and implementing risk process, procedures, strategies and plans, including a client/contractor structure that had to run as an ERM structure	I feel that risk within civil engineering has been marginalised, it is / should be (I believe) a key role within business management / controls and business intelligence, but due to some poorly developed and delivered risk management the benefits of a robust and suitable risk management structure is often not realised. I have spent the last 5 years going from business to business promoting good practice and showing by example this is what you can get from this. As such I have put myself forward as I feel this is a great forum to promote good risk practice and procedures including schedule risk analysis which has been truly misunderstood and misused. For me risk managers have been overlooked as professionals and this is also something I want to raise awareness off.	When I started in risk management for me it was a natural progression from planning requiring the same skill set of interrogation and guidance but did require practical risk training from APM and PMA. This has been supported by further education in contract risk, project management and leadership. Through engagement at senior management to individual project interfacing levels, I have experience in change control management, tender analysis, controls process and document control as well as working on SIG's with TfL. Through this I have a varied skill base and experience to bring to the table, giving me a firm belief that risk management should (with business analysis) be the heart of business and project management. Risk benefits are rarely published but done well can make or if poorly break a project and firmly want to promote the theoretical and practicable applications of risk so everyone can achieve the done well.	The amount of time would depend on when the time is required, If outside of the working day or if the activities are within the average working day. That said I should be able to offer at least 4 - 6 hours a week during the working day and approx 4 - 8 hours outside the working hours.
