Peter was an elected member of the Association for Project Management's Council (APM) from 1998 – 2001 and was a Trustee and Board Member from 2008 - 2009. He was Chair of the APM's Risk SIG for four years and was Project Manager and Managing Editor of the APM's PRAM Guide published in October 1997. Peter was re-elected as Chair again in 2020. He was elected as an Honorary Fellow of APM in 2014 in recognition of his contribution to the project management profession.

Peter is qualified as a Managing Successful Programmes (MSP) Advanced Practitioner, a PRINCE2 Practitioner and Management of Risk (M\_o\_R) Practitioner. His experience is supported membership of the Project Management Institute (PMI®) and is PMP® certification. He also holds the APM PMQ and APM PQ qualifications.

Peter has written many published papers on subjects relating to project management including risk management, resource management and satisfying the client's requirements. This published work ensures that Peter's vast and still developing expertise in project management is passed on for the benefit of others.
