

## VM SiG AGM Report

Last year began with an excellent London evening event with Steve Parker presenting, including his long experience in facilitation.

We have found much better coverage in BLOGs, so have drafted a few for the web page. Jeremy Warhurst conducted some research work with MSc Project Management graduates as participants.

Three of us contributed to an Edinburgh public sector International PM day event at Leith.

Our discussions in committee have found us thinking about research opportunities and we hope to develop that this year.

We have a handful of BLOG drafts queuing up. And some more formal value related research papers.

We hope to include some requirements engineering content, thanks to Jeremy, and in recognition of how VM is presented in the BoK.

Much experience of VM workshops is reported as being surprisingly innovative, and inspiring in output. We continually think about how we might get to tell: *“the stories of great workshops from the facilitator point of view”*. We’ve two ideas about how to do this: (i) a social media opportunity to engage members who have these stories, and (ii) maybe some presentations from experienced (IVM?) facilitators. And inspired by other recent publications plan to produce our own guidance on VM for members. Making this a small publication (8,000 words) means choosing content carefully, this will likely mean it is about de-constructing VM philosophy rather than trying to vie with established MoV and IVM approaches.
