

APM Branch Awards Student of the Year 2023

Report Guideline and Marks

APM judges* are looking for candidates to showcase their achievements with a specific project completed, within the last 3 years, in or out of school, college or university or while on placement. The candidates should illustrate the project management steps undertaken, the results and benefits of their actions and the lessons learned.

Open to all full-time or part-time students aged 16 or over who have been part of a project. Entrants can be members or non-members of APM.

Entries must take the form of a statement of up to 1,000 words addressing the criteria below. Entries can be supplemented with diagrams or images which will not be used in the word count.

Criteria	Weighting
 Project Context for your project or research Decision for selecting this project Outline the stakeholders and/or people involved 	40%
 Results and Benefits Methods and techniques used to manage the delivery of outputs, outcomes and benefits Challenges encountered and solutions created Overall lessons learned 	40%
Personal achievement • How you believe it will help you become a better project professional in the future	20%

The following marking criteria will be used:

In the event of extremely close scoring the judges will ask the finalist to provide a presentation to the audience at the Branch Awards event. Your presentation should offer an insight into your achievements and the project management steps taken during the delivery of your project.

Duration of presentation to be announced in advance of the Award event.
